The FAA's Weather Technology in the Cockpit (WTIC) Program is looking at ways to address this issue by incorporating weather and human performance research into the standards and guidance documents that support pilot weather decision making. 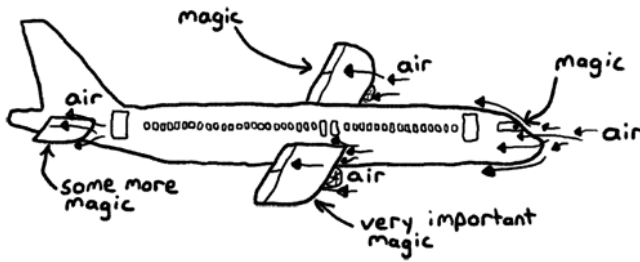
